Mobile Hotspots

School starts in August, and so much of the curriculum is online. To help access that curriculum, you can use your MCL card to check out a mobile hotspot with unlimited data from T-Mobile or Verizon Wireless – at no cost to you!

At the same time, you can borrow a laptop with Microsoft Office. Simply ask an MCL Staff Member at the library's Main Desk to check out a hotspot and/or a laptop. Both are available to borrow for up to 7 days and both are available only to Marion Carnegie Library cardholders aged 18 and up.
